PUBLIC WORKS

The provincial government and the town is pleased to announce the **tank project** is now completed. The total cost to decommission and remove the old tank and replace it with new infrastructure was approximately 1.022 million dollars. The town of Badger is grateful for the continued support of the government towards the completion of the project. The boil advisory will remain in effect until phase 2 of the laterals has been completed.

Paving tenders have been submitted, deadline to submit was Friday July 10th 2015. We are hopeful once the tender has been selected, work will begin on Main, Church and Sunset immediately. Replacement of the **remainder of water laterals** tenders for Maple, all 4 avenues, Beothuk, River, School and Kinsmen Drives will be issued in the coming weeks and work will begin on that project within the summer. Paving for those streets has been applied for through a 90-10 project with the provincial government.
